Imam Basil Abdullah | Founder, Masjid Taleem Muhammad



Imam Basil Abdullah is a living testament to the power of transformation and redemption. Originally sentenced to 99 years in prison for a crime involving drugs and a death, he underwent a profound change during his incarceration. His journey led him to embrace Islam and make it the cornerstone of his life. Over four decades ago, Imam Abdullah started the practice of Salat-ul-Juma' in his old neighborhood, turning a former crack house into a place of worship. Additionally, he established a gymnasium to engage local teenagers, providing them with opportunities to avoid the pitfalls he once faced. His remarkable journey from a troubled past to becoming a respected figure in the community highlights the transformative power of faith and community support.

Dr. Laeeq Khan | Founder, ISGH Prison Dawah

Dr. Laeeq Khan is a dedicated pioneer of prison dawah for over three decades. Operating from Masjid Bilal in North Houston, he has provided essential dawah materials to inmates, volunteers and Muslim Chaplains. Three years ago, Dr. Khan encouraged Salaam Reentry to expand services to incarcerated sisters in prison, as we have services sisters in county jails. Following his advice, Salaam Reentry has actively been coordinating efforts to serve all fifteen female prisons in the State of Texas.

Tabari Abdul-Zahir | Reentry Manager & Drug Counselor, Tayba Foundation
Tabari Abdul-Zahir, the Reentry Manager at Tayba Foundation, began his formal study
of Islamic Sciences in 2003 under the guidance of scholars from Zaytuna Institute.
Unfortunately, a series of life choices led to his incarceration for a non-violent drug
offense from 2005 to 2016. During his time in prison, Abdul-Zahir dedicated himself to
learning and teaching key Islamic subjects, including Aqeedah, Fiqh, Tazkiya, and
Arabic, which form the foundation of the Tayba Foundation's educational
curriculum. Upon his release, he pursued further education, earning an Associate's
degree in Behavioral Sciences and a Master's in Clinical Social Work. Currently, Br.
Tabari Abdul-Zahir works as a therapist and drug counselor in Southern California,
exemplifying the power of personal transformation and education.

Upon his release, he continued his Islamic studies and became a public speaker (khateeb) in the state of Connecticut. In his current role at Link Outside, Brother Jesse plays a significant state of Connecticut. In his current role at Link Outside, Brother Jesse plays a significant part in promoting Islamic spiritual practices for inmates. He conducts weekly classes at California State Prison-Los Angeles County (Lancaster) and California Institute for Women (CIW), where he imparts Islamic studies and spirituality practices. Jesse Maroney is a dedicated student of the works and teachings of Shaykh Faisal Abdur Razak and Shaykh Mohammed Al-Yacoubi, and his journey from incarceration to becoming an advocate for Islamic education and spirituality is truly inspiring.


